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OUR PURPOSE

The place of dramatic clubs in the life of eastern colleges is one so well established that it was felt that the University of British Columbia should not be without a similar organization. So last November the Players' Club, with forty members, was formed with the purpose of stimulating throughout the college an interest in the drama.

In looking for a suitable vehicle for the first public performance the executive seriously considered the staging of one of the comedies of Shakespeare, as a fitting observance of the Tercentenary celebration of this. year. But with so many of the male students enlisted, and with two afternoons a week given to military drill, it was I and that many of the young men in attendance at the University could not find time for the requisite rehearsals. The result was that the membership was largely drawn from among the young women students, and it did not seem just to stage a play in which, at best, there would be no more than four female roles. Though it was not without regret that modern works more suited to the personnel of the club were selected, the Jerome comedy and the little playlet of contrasting tone are offered as quite worthy of the attention given them.
