### **Fonds Description**

**Reginald Walter Brock fonds.** – 1920-1959.

#### **Biographical Sketch**

R.W. Brock was born in Perth Ontario and he graduated from Queen's University with an M.A. in Geology. His many professional appointments included his work as a geologist with Dawson Survey of British Columbia (1897), the Chair of Geology at Queens University (1902-1907) and Director of the Geological Survey of Canada (1907-1914). Brock became one of the first four men selected by the University of British Columbia President F.F. Westbrook to form the nucleus of the staff of the new University. In 1914, Brock became Dean of Applied Science although his career was interrupted by war service (1914-1919). He returned to the University in 1919 and continued as a geology professor and dean until his death, together with his wife, in a 1935 airplane accident.

#### **Scope and Content**

The fonds consists primarily of material accumulated during a survey of the Colony of Hong Kong undertaken by the Department of Geology between 1923 and 1933. It is composed of notes, maps and reports generated by Brock and his associates. There are also some papers from the files of the Department of Geology. The papers have been roughly sorted according to form. Also included are several non-UBC publications originally kept in the Brock family library.
