# **Fonds Description**

**Jan de Bruyn fonds.** – 1951-2016.

## **Biographical Sketch**

Jan de Bruyn was born in Abcoude, Netherlands, in 1918. He obtained his B.A. from UBC (1949), and M.A. in English from the University of London (1951). He joined UBC's Department of English as a lecturer and remained there until his retirement as associate professor in 1983. De Bruyn was the founding editor of *Prism* and edited the departmental newsletter, *The Newsense*. He also co-authored *The Canadian Writer's Handbook*, first published in 1980. After his retirement, he and his wife moved, first to Sechelt, then to South Slocan, and finally to Castlegar, B.C. In Castlegar he led the "Lifewriters", consisting of senior citizens who met regularly to tell and write stories about their lives – de Bruyn edited several published collections of their stories. He died in 2017.

#### **Scope and Content**

Fonds consists of correspondence and reports relating to de Bruyn's duties as a member of the Department of English at UBC, as well as a selection of his CVs, and personal correspondence from Roy Daniells (including verses), Earle Birney, Margaret Laurence, Dorothy Livesay and Ethel Wilson. Also included are records from the "Lifewriters" (copies of stories, correspondence, financial records, and newspaper clippings), and two unpublished autobiographies ("C'est Moi" and "The Immigrants").

BOX 2

Lifewriters (1990-2016, predominant 2004-2012)

These records document the Lifewriters' Group, established by Jan de Bruyn after his retirement in Castlegar. The group consisted of senior citizens who met regularly to tell and write stories about their lives. They published eight collections of personal stories from 2005 to 2012, with de Bruyn acting as editor.

The records include copies of Lifewriters' stories; correspondence with subscribers, Lifewriters contributors, and others; financial records and grant applications; and newspaper clippings about the Lifewriters. They have been maintained in their original order.
