# **Fonds Description**

#### **S. Mack Eastman fonds.** – 1912-1968.

1.3 m of textual records.37 photographs.

#### **Biographical Sketch**

S. Mack Eastman (1882-1968), who became the University of British Columbia's first professor of history, was born in Oshawa, Ontario. After completing his undergraduate degree at the University of Toronto, Eastman used fellowships to study at the University of Paris (1908-1911) and Columbia University (1911-1912). During these years he developed a keen interest in international affairs. After leaving Columbia, he went to Calgary College where he taught history and introduced International Studies into the curriculum. Eastman moved to UBC in 1915 and remained at the university until 1925 (with a brief interruption between 1916 and 1918 for war service). In 1919, he became head of the Department of History, holding the position until 1925 when he resigned to work in the International Labour Office in Geneva. He fled Europe after the collapse of the Western Front (1940) and returned to Canada taking a position at the University of Saskatchewan. Eastman retired to Vancouver in 1949 and became actively involved in the United Nations Association of Canada and the Canadian Institute of International Affairs.

#### Scope and Content

The fonds consists of the following series: biographical material, personal correspondence (1912-1968), addresses (1914-1961), clippings both by and about Eastman (1912-1955), copies of published articles (1909-1957), lecture notes and research material, records relating to the Canadian Institute of International Affairs (1950-1962) and the United Nations Association of Canada (1952-1968), pamphlets/published material and photographs.

**Biographical Material series.** -- 1912-1915.

2 files of textual records.

The series consists of Eastman's CV and list of publications (n.d.). It also includes a small file from Calgary College (1912-1915).

Correspondence series. -- 1912-1968.

16 cm of textual records.

Series consists primarily of incoming and some copies of outgoing correspondence.

Addresses series. -- 1914-1961.

9 cm of textual records.

Series consists of typescript copies of public addresses given by Eastman.

Newspaper Clippings series. -- 1912-1955.

4 cm of textual records.

Series consists of newspaper clippings documenting reports of Eastman's public lectures and copies of newspaper articles written by Eastman.

Published Articles series. -- 1909-1957.

9 cm of textual records.

Series consists of copies of Eastman's articles published in various journals and other publications.

Lecture Notes and Research Material series. -- 1912-1961.

32 cm of textual records.

Series consists of notes, newspaper clippings and printed material arranged by subject.

United Nations Association of Canada/Canadian Institute of International Affairs series. -- 1950-1968.

7 cm of textual records.

Series consists of minutes, reports, financial records, printed material and meeting notices arising from Eastman's participation in the UNAC and CIIA.

## Pamphlets and Published Material series. -- 1921-1958.

45 cm of textual records and published materials.

Series consists of pamphlets and published material collected by Eastman relating generally to the study of international history.

# Photographs series. -- 1915-1936.

37 photographs.

The series consists of 37 photographs most of which were created after Eastman' career at UBC.

Portrait images of Eastman are included in UBC Archives' Historical Photograph Database as UBC 30.1. Images depicting events and other individuals (UBC 31.2) are not included.
