## **Fonds Description**

Norman Epstein fonds. – 1944-2022. 1.02 m of textual records. 14 photographs. 1 CD.

#### **Biographical Sketch**

Norman Epstein was a long-time faculty member in the UBC Department of Chemical and Biological Engineering, and one of Canada's best-known chemical engineers. Born in Montreal in 1923, Epstein earned bachelor's and master's degrees in chemical engineering at McGill (1945, 1946), and a doctorate in engineering science from New York University (1953). He started work at UBC in 1951 as an instructor in chemical engineering, and became an assistant professor in 1954. He was promoted to full professor in 1965, and was named professor emeritus upon his retirement in 1988. He continued to publish and present at professional conferences for many years after his "retirement".

Epstein was a leader in research in the areas of spouted beds, heat exchanger fouling, liquid-solid and three-phase fluidization, and dynamic particulate processes such as sedimentation. The book *Spouted Beds*, which he co-wrote with Kishan B. Mathur and published in 1974, remains an authoritative text on the subject. Within his department Epstein was respected as a leader who fostered an inclusive departmental and professional community in support of learning and scholarship, as well as both professional and community service. He also taught in UBC's first-year Arts One programme. He was editor of *The Canadian Journal of Chemical Engineering* from 1985 to 1990, and served on many committees and executives for the Chemical Institute of Canada and the Canadian Society for Chemical Engineering. For his many professional contributions Epstein was honoured with the Jules Stachiewicz Medal in 1988 and the R.S. Jane Memorial Lecture Award in 1989. Also, when UBC Chemical and Biological Engineering moved into a new building in 2006, the new departmental reading room was named in his honour.

Outside his professional activities Epstein was an active member of the UBC Faculty Association, the B.C. Civil Liberties Association, Amnesty International, and Engineers for Nuclear Disarmament. He spoke on various social and political topics, such as socialism, anarchism, anti-Semitism, Arab-Israeli relations, and the Cold War, and corresponded regularly with prominent social critic Noam Chomsky. Epstein died in July 2023, just a few months shy of his 100th birthday.

#### **Scope and Content**

Fonds consists of materials documenting Norman Epstein's professional and personal life and interests, and includes correspondence, speaker's notes, off-prints of Epstein's professional articles, publications (including books), newspaper and magazine clippings, photographs, and one CD. They are arranged in the following series: Professional Work, UBC, Speeches, Correspondence, Subject Files, and Photographs and Other Media.

## **Series Descriptions**

Professional Work series. – 1944-2013.

35.5 cm of textual records.

Series consists of materials documenting Epstein's professional career and activities, and includes copies of his degree dissertations, copies and off-prints of his articles, a copy of his book *Spouted Beds* along with the Russian translation, scholarly publications that Epstein edited or which included his work, correspondence, other writings, his CV, his awards and honours, and other writings.

Materials are arranged in chronological order. The articles are kept in numbered order presumably arranged by Epstein.

**UBC series.** – 1956-2006.

8.5 cm of textual records.

Series consists of materials documenting Epstein's activities and interests at the University of British Columbia, and includes correspondence, reports, other writings, and publications.

Materials are arranged in chronological order.

**Speeches series.** – 1958-1996.

12 cm of textual records.

Series consists of notes for Epstein's public speeches, and includes index cards with his handwritten notes. The speeches are on a wide variety of topics, including politics, current events, and social issues, and reflect Epstein's interests and opinions in these areas.

Materials are arranged in approximately chronological order, taking into account the sizes of the cards and how many are used for each speech.

Correspondence series. – 1963-2022.

17 cm of textual records.

Series consists of letters and other correspondence received by Epstein, and copies of some correspondence sent by him. Notable is correspondence with noted social critic Noam Chomsky, including discussions about the latter's visits to UBC; and correspondence with fellow UBC faculty member Werner Cohn regarding their differing views on Israeli-Arab relations.

Materials are arranged primarily alphabetically by correspondent surname, except for those files containing correspondence from various persons, which are arranged chronologically.

Subject Files series. – 1944-2017.

29 cm of textual records.

Series consists textual materials acquired or created by Norman Epstein on a variety of subjects and topics of interest, and includes correspondence, other writings by Epstein, publications, and published items including clippings and website printouts.

Materials are arranged alphabetically by subject.

Photographs and Other Media series. – 1975-2008.

14 photographs.

1 CD.

Series consists of non-textual records created or acquired by Epstein, and includes photographs and one CD. The photographs are all prints, some colour and some black-and-white, and depict Epstein at various events together with colleagues and friends. The CD documents Epstein's presentation at a Canadian Society of Chemical Engineers conference in Edmonton in 2007.
