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# **Fonds Description**

**Faculty of Graduate and Postdoctoral Studies fonds.** – 1932-2009. 10.8 m of textual materials.

#### **Administrative History**

The Faculty of Graduate Studies was created in 1947, with Henry Angus as its Director and later Dean. Prior to that year the work of coordinating graduate courses and regulations had been done by the individual Faculties, each acting for its own students, together with a coordinating committee. In 2013 FGS was renamed Faculty of Graduate and Postdoctoral Studies.

The Faculty works in conjunction with departments, schools, and faculties to coordinate and maintain the quality of all graduate programs at the University. It derives its legislative and legal authority from the Graduate Council. In all matters concerning admission, scholarships, programs, and examinations, the Dean and Associate Dean act with the Registrar as administrative officers of the Graduate Council. Several committees have been involved in administering the Faculty, including the Executive Committee, the President's Committee of Graduate Deans (which considered matters referred to it by the President), and the Committee on Graduate Studies (struck by the Dean in the mid-1960's to consider all aspects of graduate work on campus, and to make recommendations to revise the Faculty's operations). The Faculty also administers two residential graduate colleges, Green College and St. John's College. For the Deans of the Faculty of Graduate and Postdoctoral Studies, consult the List of Deans.

#### **Custodial History**

The applications for graduate studies predate the formation of the Faculty of Graduate Studies, and presumably came originally from the Registrar's Office and were transferred to the Faculty in the early 1950's. The remainder of the fonds was created by the Faculty Dean's Office.

#### **Scope and Content**

The Fonds consists of the records of the Executive Committee of Graduate Studies (1950-1968), the Committee on Graduate Studies (1964-1967), and the President's Committee of Academic Deans (1969-1974), as well as applications from prospective students (1932-1951). It also consists of the records of various committees pertaining to the creation and governance of the Graduate School (1950-2007); Administrative files (1966-2007); Reports and Reviews by and pertaining to Graduate School and its associated entities, degrees, and programs (1970-2009); records related to the

governance, retention, and fellowship with future, current, and past Graduate Students (1979-2006); Policy, Academic Degree, Centre, College, and Institute Proposals (1966-2004); Correspondence (1983-1994); Inter-University Activities and Committees with which the Graduate School was associated (1964-1974); External Relations (1966-2004); as well as applications from prospective students (1932-1951)

#### Notes

Fonds consists of institutional records – access requests must be reviewed by the University's FOIPOP Coordinator.

The arrangement of files within each series vary due the fact that three different arrangement types (Alpha-Numeric, Numeric, and Alphabetical) existed within the fonds at various stages. All series, sub-series, and files were arranged by the processor with the numeric and alphabetical systems in mind. The processor arranged each series according to the logical and/or predominant system within the series. Some sub-series within a series differ in filing systems due to different types of files preserved in one system versus another.

# **Series Descriptions**

Graduate Council and Graduate Studies Committees series. – 1950-2006.

1.03 m of textual materials

The series consists of minutes, agendas, correspondence, reports, and proposals pertaining to the following series: Executive Committee of Graduate Studies, Committee on Graduate Studies, Faculty of Graduate Studies, Graduate Council, and Other Committees and Related Materials. This series was arranged with files from the later alphabetical system strategically rearranged to match the files of the early numeric system.

Administrative Series. – 1966-2007.

1.38 m of textual materials

This Series consists of materials related to the functions and operations of the department. It consists of the following subseries: General Files, Dept. and Student Finances, Calendar, Admissions, AWARDS/Scholarships, Procedures, Student Academic Services, Promotion and Recruiting, Research, Reorganization, Conferences and Retreats, Freedom of information, and Visitors. This series was arranged numerically, except when some types of files only existed in the alphabetic system.

Reports and Reviews Series. – 1970-2009.

1.36 m of textual materials

It consists of the following subseries: School of Graduate Studies, Faculties, Schools, Departments, Degrees and Programs, General, Centres. This series is arranged alphabetically. This series consists of correspondence, minutes, reports and reviews pertaining to various departments and programs.

**Graduate Students series.** – 1979-2006.

47.1 cm of textual materials

This series consists of materials specifically related to potential students, current students, and alumni. It consists of agreements between universities, correspondence, finances, minutes, policies, surveys, and time completion studies. This series is arranged alphabetically.

Proposals series. – 1966-2004.

2 m of textual materials

This series consists of correspondence, minutes, reports and other materials related to proposals by the School of Graduate Studies. The series consists of the following subseries: Policies and Information, General and Other, Certifications and Diplomas, Masters, Doctorates, and Centres, Colleges, and Institutes. This series is arranged alphabetically. Most of the files from the earlier numeric system had simply given the next available number with no further thought to the arrangement.

#### Correspondence series. – 1983-1994

73.1cm of textual materials

This series consists of correspondence, mostly inter-University, between various individuals, offices, and programs. It has the following subseries:

Registrars/Depts./Committees, Deans, President's Office, and Other. This series is arranged alphabetically.

#### Inter-University Activities and Committees series. – 1964-2007

2.58 m of textual materials

This series consists of correspondence, documentation, minutes, notifications, reports and other materials pertaining to the University at Large and many committees that the Head of Graduate Studies was involved with or reported to. It is divided into the following subseries: President's Committee of Academic Deans (alphabetical), President's Committees (numeric), University at Large (alphabetical), Senate (numeric), Other University Committees (alphabetical), and Faculty Awards Committee – Killam and other (alphabetical). This series has a mixture of arrangement systems. Each subseries is noted with the arrangement used.

#### External Relations series. – 1966-2004

1.14m of textual materials

This series consists of correspondence, reports, and related materials pertaining to relationships the School of Graduate Studies, at large, or the Dean, specifically, had with agencies, associations, schools, and other entities outside of UBC. It consists of the following subseries: Associations (alphabetical), External Organizations (numeric), Granting Agencies (alphabetical), and Other Agencies (alphabetic). This series has a mixture of arrangement systems. Each sub-series is noted with the arrangement used.

#### Applications for Graduate Studies series. – 1932-1951.

13 cm of textual materials.

Series consists of applications for acceptance into courses leading to a Master's Degree.

Series is restricted, as it contains personal information.
