Biographical Sketch

Valerie Haig-Brown (1936-) is the eldest child of the noted British Columbia author and conservationist Roderick Haig-Brown (1908-1976). She attended the University of British Columbia from 1953-1955. While at UBC she worked as a reporter for *The Ubyssey*. She was also a socialite, joined Kappa Kappa Gamma sorority, and made her presence known on campus. After graduation, she worked as a magazine editor for several popular Toronto-based magazines before moving back to British Columbia in 1978 to act as her father's literary executor. She also went on to author several of her own books. Valerie is known in her own right as a conservationist. She climbed Vancouver Island's Mt. Haig-Brown, named for her father, when she was 70.

Scope and Content

The fonds consists of Haig-Brown's memorabilia from her time at UBC from 1953 to 1956, and includes printed/published materials and ephemera.
