Biographical Sketch

William Edmund (Bill) Messenger was a professor of English at UBC from 1966 to 1988. He was born in Independence, Missouri on February 1931 to Edmund Earl Messenger and Inga Therese Messenger (nee Enger). He attended elementary schools in Kansas City, Missouri; Kansas City, Kansas; Merriam, Kansas; and finally, Everett, Washington. He spent two years at Everett Junior College and majored in Architectural Engineering. From there he began working at the Boeing Aircraft Company in Seattle. While working at Boeing, he entered the United States Air Force where he learned and taught electronics for four years. After leaving the Air Force, he went back to Boeing. In 1955, Messenger entered the University of Washington Seattle and completed a BA in English in 1956. In September 1957, he began graduate work Cornell University as a National Woodrow Wilson Fellow and continued on a Cornell University Junior Graduate Fellowship in 1958 and 1959. At Cornell, Messenger met Ann Parshall who was also a student of English. After graduation, he taught at Bucknell University in Lewisburg, Pennsylvania. In 1960, Bill and Ann were married in Ann's hometown Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. In the early 1960's, Messenger began post-graduate studies at the University of California, Berkeley. In 1968, Messenger received his doctoral degree from Berkley and became an Assistant Professor at UBC in 1969, moving to the rank of Associate Professor in 1982. His areas of special interest were nineteenth and twentiethcentury British and American fiction and the works of writer Joseph Conrad.

William Messenger co-authored and co-edited several works during his career at UBC, including the *Canadian Writer's Handbook* (1980, 1986, and 1995), *Active Voice* (1980, 1996, 1991), *Literature in English* (1993), and *Elements of Writing: A Process Rhetoric for Canadian Students* (1984). Messenger was also active in the academic literary community. He served as the Canadian National Editor for the editorial board of the international literary journal Conradiana from 1969 to 1980, contributed several papers and reviews on the topics of Conrad and Melville for various other academic literary journals, and was a member of numerous professional and learned societies. Messenger's personal pursuits included the creation of games and word puzzles and he contributed a regular puzzle column called "Triple Ploy" to Western Living Magazine in the 1970's and 1980's. Messenger also enjoyed cooking, gardening, and produced two works of fiction: a sea-

themed novel entitled "The Last Horizon," as well as a murder mystery called "A Necessary End" that he co-wrote with Ann Parshall Messenger under the pseudonym Edmond Carey; both of which remained unpublished.

In 1988, Messenger retired and spent the next eight years caring for his wife. Ann Parshall Messenger died in Vancouver, Canada on February 1996 of multiple cancer. After his wife's death, William Messenger donated part of his personal collection of books to the University of British Columbia and Simon Fraser University Libraries. He also provided endowments to UBC for the Ann and William Messenger Fellowship in Graduate Education and the Ann and William Messenger Graduate Fellowship. William Messenger died on June 15, 2003 in Vancouver, Canada, from pneumonia and complications related to Alzheimer's Disease.

Scope and Content

The fonds consists of correspondence, revisions, drafts, notes, theses materials, reviews, photographs and negatives pertaining to Messenger's personal life, education, career, research and personal interests and the various publications that he was associated with. The fonds also includes game boards, notes, drafts and original word puzzles. Finally, the fonds contains the Ann Parshall Messenger sous-fonds.

Series consists of records pertaining to the anthology edited by Messenger and Bill New in 1993. There are four sub-series: Research Notes Sub-Series, Permissions Sub-Series, Miscellaneous Sub-Series, and Chronologies Sub-Series.

Boxes 1-12, 13(1-6), 14(1-35).

Research Notes sub-series. - [n.d.]. 76 cm of textual records.

Sub-series consists of records that were used for research during the creation of Literature In English. Each file within the sub-series pertains to a particular writer or poet that was featured in the anthology.

Boxes 1-12, 14(17-18).

Permissions sub-series. - 1990-1992. 5 cm of textual records.

Sub-series consists of permission forms and permission tracking forms for various works that were published in Literature in English.

Box 13(1-3).

Miscellaneous sub-series. - [1980?-199?]. 19 cm of textual records. 8 photographs. 14 negatives.

Sub-series consists of records that were used for or produced during the creation of Literature in English. These records include correspondence, revision, notes, reviews, designs, and various illustrations.

Boxes 13(4-6), 14(1-16).

Chronologies sub-series. - [n.d.]. 10 cm of textual records.

The sub-series consists of various records pertaining to the chronologies created for and included in Literature In English, including clippings and notes, revisions and an appendix.

Box 14(30-35).

Active Voice series. - 1978-1993. 31cm of textual records.

Series consists of notes, clippings, articles, reviews, revisions, and correspondence pertaining to Active Voice, a reader co-edited by Messenger and William New that was published in 1980 (1st ed.), 1986 (2nd ed.) and 1991 (3rd ed.).

Boxes 13(7-13), 14(36-43).

Canadian Writer's Handbook series. - [1980?-1995?].

34 cm of textual records.

Series consists of records pertaining to the Canadian Writer's Handbook, a writing guide co-authored by Messenger and Jan de Bruyn that was published in 1980 (1st ed.), 1986 (2nd ed.) and 1995 (3rd ed.). There are two sub-series: Miscellaneous Sub-Series and Subject Sub-Series.

Box 15.

Miscellaneous sub-series. - 1980-1995. 31 cm of textual records.

Sub-series consists of notes, revisions, correspondence, reviews, marketing materials, and drafts pertaining to the Canadian Writer's Handbook (1st, 2nd and 3rd eds.).

Box 15 (1-26).

Subject sub-series<u>.</u> - [n.d.] 3 cm of textual records.

Sub-series consists of notes and clippings on various subjects that were included in the Canadian Writer's Handbook.

Box 15 (27-37).

Elements of Writing series. - [1982?-1988?].

30 cm of textual records.

Series consists of records pertaining to Elements of Writing: a Process Rhetoric for Canadian Students (previously called "Essentials of Writing"), a writing guide coauthored by Messenger and Peter A Taylor that was published in 1984. These records include correspondence, notes, drafts, reviews, permission forms, and revisions.

Box 16.

Conradiana series. - 1968-1977. 6 cm of textual records.

Series consists of records pertaining to Messenger's role as the Canadian National Editor of Conradiana between the years of 1969 to 1980. These records include correspondence, notes, clippings, drafts and annotated copies of articles and reviews, and revisions.

Box 17(1-9).

Prentice-Hall Canada series. - 1984-1985.

1 cm of textual records.

Series consists of records pertaining to Messenger's miscellaneous editorial and review projects for Prentice-Hall Canada Inc. These records include an annotated policy document and correspondence.

Box 17(10-11).

Thesis Bibliography Series Project series. - 1970-1972.

1 cm of textual records.

Series consists of records pertaining to Messenger's participation in the Thesis Bibliography Series Project, an international bibliography of doctoral dissertations and masters' theses on selected writers. These records include correspondence and pamphlets.

Box 17(12).

Subject series. - [n.d.] 1 cm of textual records.

Series consists of notes and clippings pertaining to miscellaneous subjects.

Box 17(13-14).

UBC English Department series. - 1966-2003. 39.5 cm of textual records.

Series consists of records of William Messenger's years with the UBC English Department. There are four sub-series: Academic Teaching Career Sub-Series, ComPost Sub-Series, Course Materials Sub-Series and Miscellaneous Sub-Series.

Boxes 17(15-54), 18(1-4).

Academic Teaching Career sub-series. -1981, 1966-1987, 2003. 5 cm of textual records.

Sub-series consists of correspondence, applications, curriculum vitae, notes and clippings on Messenger's teaching career with the UBC English Department, including tributes given at his memorial service.

Box 17(15-19).

ComPost sub-series. - 1973-1977. 1.5 cm of textual records.

Sub-series consists of issues of the ComPost, the English Department's Composition newsletter, which Messenger created and edited, including notes, distribution lists, memos and articles.

Box 17(20-21).

Course Materials sub-series. - 1963-1987. 30 cm of textual records.

Sub-series consists of notes, outlines, handouts, bibliographies, articles, tests and assignments of the different courses taught by Messenger in the English Department as an Instructor, Associate Professor and Associate Professor.

Box 17(22-54).

Miscellaneous sub-series. - 1982-1989, 1990. 3 cm of textual records.

Sub-series consists of miscellaneous notes, correspondence and articles related to the English Department.

Box 18(1-4).

UBC Gifts and Endowments series. - 1995-2000.

2 cm of textual records.

Series consists of records relating to Gifts and Endowments from William and Ann Messenger, which includes correspondence, notices of awards, and book lists.

Box 18(5-8).

Student Records series. - 1958-2003. 37 cm of textual records.

Series consists of Messenger's records as an undergraduate student at the University of Washington (1955-1956), a graduate student at Cornell University (1957-1959) and a post-graduate student at UCLA at Berkeley (1960-1966). These records include correspondence, student papers, artwork, designs and pencil drawings (thumbnail faculty drawings), manuscripts, notebooks, examinations, assignments, and transcripts.

Box 18(9-39).

Theses series. - 1958-1968. 18 cm of textual records [two volumes].

Series consists of Messenger's thesis presented to Cornell University and his doctoral dissertation presented to the University of California at Berkeley (Box 13), including notes, correspondence, drafts and chapter notes.

Boxes 13(14-15), 19(1-6), 19(33).

Career and Employment series. - 1958-1962. 3 cm of textual records

Series consists of correspondence and personnel files on career and employment prior to Messenger's teaching career at UBC.

Box 19(7-8).

Personal Correspondence series. - 1948-2003. 8 cm of textual records.

Series consists of various correspondence, Christmas letters, postcards received and sent out by Messenger to family, friends, colleagues, university libraries and publishers, including numerous hand-written notes, written after Ann Messenger's death, found scattered among his correspondence files.

Box 19(9-22, 34-35).

Miscellaneous Personal series. - 1933-1999. 8 cm of textual records.

Series consists of various miscellaneous records including newspaper clippings, correspondence, newsletters, notebooks, travel logs and diaries, calendars, his diary as a homeowner and his interests in gardening and genealogy.

Box 19(23-32).

Academic Writings series. - 1967-1978. 13 cm of textual records.

Series consists of offprints, reprints, photocopies and drafts of Messenger's essays, reviews, and articles. It also includes poems and limericks, notes, clippings, and correspondence.

Box 20(1-15).

Novel series. - [1959-196?] 2 cm of textual records.

Series consists of draft chapters, clippings, and notes of Messenger's work on his seathemed novel called "The Last Horizon."

Box 20(16-17).

Detective and Murder Mystery series. - 1964-1974.

5 cm of textual records.

Series consists of Messenger's works of fiction-- his detective story and murder mystery--which includes his manuscripts, outlines, notes, correspondence with publishers and the final manuscript of A Necessary End, a murder mystery co-authored by Messenger with his wife Ann under the pseudonym of Edmund Carey.

Box 20(18-21).

Games and Word Puzzles series. - [197? -198?]. 33 cm of textual records. 4 game boards.

Series consists of records pertaining to games and word puzzles created by Messenger. There are three sub-series: Miscellaneous Sub-Series, "Triple-Ploy" Sub-Series, and Board Games Sub-Series.

Boxes 21(1-44), 22.

Miscellaneous sub-series. - [197? -198?]. 30cm of textual records.

Sub-series consists of records pertaining to the creation of various types of word games and puzzles. These records include original, copy and draft puzzles, notes, completed puzzles (not created by Messenger), and clippings.

Box 21(1-41).

"Triple-Ploy" sub-series. - [197? -198?]. 3cm of textual records.

Sub-series consists of records pertaining to Messenger's regular puzzle column "Triple-Ploy", which was published in Western Living Magazine. These records include correspondence, completed puzzles and revisions.

Box 21(42-44).

Board Games sub-series. - [n.d.]. 4 game boards.

Sub-series consists of game boards and draft game boards for three different board games: "Cheat"; "Hugger-Mugger" and an untitled geographic board game. The game boards are in oversize boxes.

Box 22.

Photographs series. - 1979-1998. 28 photographs.

Series consists of colour photographs of William Messenger, his wife Ann and colleagues and friends, including pictures of his house. These are the photographs from the accrual in 2003 only. The series is arranged by year.

Sous-fonds Description

Ann Parshall Messenger sous-fonds. - 1934-1996.

12 cm of textual records.2 portraits (photocopies).

Ann Parshall Messenger was born on May 31, 1933 in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Ann Messenger finished her BA from Oberlin College, Ohio in 1955 and another BA from Oxford, England in 1957. She was a Snell Scholar at Oberlin and a Fulbright Scholar at Oxford. She completed her MA from Somerville College (Oxford) in 1961 and her Ph.D. from Cornell University in 1964. It was at Cornell that Ann met William Messenger, who was also a student in English. Both were married in 1960 in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Ann Messenger taught at Bucknell University, UCLA at Berkeley, and San Francisco State College in California. In 1966, Ann and William Messenger moved to Vancouver, British Columbia and both taught at the UBC Department of English as lecturers. In 1968, Ann Messenger moved to Simon Fraser University (SFU) where she rose to the rank of full Professor. Forced to leave her teaching career in 1988 because of a physically debilitating illness, Ann Messenger directed her intellectual energies towards research on nearly forgotten 18th century women poets. Ann Messenger's writings include His and Hers: Essays in Restoration and Eighteenth Century Literature (1986), Gender at Work: Four Women Writers of three Eighteenth Century (1990), Dinarbas (Early Women Writers, 1650-1800) - Ellis Cornelia Knight (1992), Woman and Poet in the Eighteenth Century: The Life of Mary Whateley Darwall, and Pastoral Tradition and the Female Talent, the last two which were published after her death. In 1993, she set up the Aphra Behn Endowment Fund at SFU which was renamed the Anne Messenger Graduate Endowment Fund in 1996, after her death on February 1, 1996 from multiple cancer.

The sous-fonds consists of correspondence, clippings, student records, student notebooks and papers, yearbook, poetry, cookbook manuscript, portraits, obituary notices and tributes.
