Administrative History

In 2014 a research project was conducted by Judith Saltman of UBC’s School of Library, Archival, and Information Studies, and SLAIS graduate student Bonnie Tulloch. The project was called “No Man Is An Island: Examining island imagery and its relation to female identity in a selection of Canadian children’s and young adult literature”. It was a literary analysis involving interviews with several award-winning British Columbia children’s book authors. These authors – Deirdre Baker, Polly Horvath, and Kit Pearson – shared a common theme: writing children’s and young adult novels set in the B.C. Gulf Islands. Portions of those interviews were used in the creation of several academic papers and presentations.

Scope and Content

Fonds consists of documentation of the “No Man Is An Island” project, and includes interview transcripts, correspondence, and consent forms of interviewees, in paper form. Also included is a USB stick containing digital transcripts and audio files from the interviews.
