Collection Description

History of Education Research Collection / John Neil Sutherland (collector). – 1888-1909, 1948-1949.

14 cm of textual materials.

Collector's Biographical Sketch

John Neil Sutherland was born in Vancouver, and received his M.A. from UBC in 1960.

Scope and Content

Collection consists of materials which deal with two different subject areas of interest to Sutherland. One series consists of microfilmed records relating to the establishment of the Macdonald Institute, which later merged with two other colleges to form the University of Guelph. The other series consists of photocopies of records assembled by Sutherland for various research projects on the history of education. Also included is a folder of class materials from a UBC course on the History of Canada created and collected by Sutherland in 1948-49.

Notes

The materials were originally donated by Sutherland to the University in the 1960s, but were later borrowed by him and not returned to the University Archives until 1985.

The UBC class materials folder was donated by Sutherland in August 2011.
