Biographical Sketch

Zipporah Ritchie "Zippy" Woodward (1885-1976) was a theatre director, writer, and supporter of the University of British Columbia and of the arts community in Vancouver from the 1920s to the 1970s. Through family and friends she was wellconnected within the Vancouver "establishment" of the mid-twentieth century. She was no relation to the Woodward's department store family.

Born in Minneapolis, Minnesota, "Zippy" (or "Bizzy") Ritchie attended Wells College in Aurora, New York, in the early 1900's, where she was class president, editor of the school journal, and member of the Play Committee. She withdrew from Wells to marry businessman Ernest Austin Woodward in 1907. She moved with her family from Winnipeg to Vancouver in the early 1920s, where Ernest Woodward built a successful business, the Columbia Grain Elevator Company, with an innovative grain elevator design. They resided on Vancouver's affluent Point Grey Road, in a home called "Seagate". When Ernest's business fortunes waned the couple moved to an apartment in Vancouver's West End; by the time of his death from dementia in 1954, Zipporah had found accommodation in the affluent Shaughnessy neighbourhood.

Woodward directed numerous plays for Vancouver Little Theatre in the 1920s and 1930s. In 1941 she directed George Bernard Shaw's *Candida* for the UBC Players' Club. Included in the cast were Arthur Hill, who later became a famous Canadian actor, and Lister Sinclair, who went on to be a CBC broadcaster and playwright. In 1945 she directed *Claudia* for the UBC Players Club Alumni.

Zipporah was known among her friends and family as a prolific letter writer. In return, they would often compose humorous poems for her on her birthday. She also wrote several scripts and short stories, which she tried unsuccessfully to sell. In 1945 she published a series of articles in the Vancouver *Daily Province* newspaper titled "Letters of a Mother to Her Son".

As a supporter of the Canadian arts community, Woodward was at various times on the Advisory Council to the National Film Society; president of the British Columbia Drama Association (now Theatre BC); chair of the Vancouver Symphony Society; a member of the Governing Committee of the Canadian Drama Awards; and a director of the

Community Arts Council of Vancouver. In 1956 she appeared as a panelist discussing "Canadian Playwriting" at UBC's Frederic Wood Theatre. Woodward was also active in the Women's Auxiliary of Vancouver General Hospital: in 1954 she was chair and second vice-president, and in 1963 she was made Honorary President.

Woodward's son Geoffrey attended UBC (B.A. 1930) and was a member of Alpha Delta Phi – she was a member of the fraternity's "Mothers' Club". Her daughter Shirley married A.E. "Dal" Grauer, who was president of the B.C. Electric Company (1946-61) and Chancellor of UBC (1957-61); he died in 1961. Shirley subsequently married prominent Vancouver lawyer Walter S. Owen, who later served as BC's Lieutenant-Governor (1973-78). Zipporah had two other children: Henry (who died at age 4), and Peter.

Zipporah Woodward was supported by her daughter Shirley and her family in her later years; she died in 1976.

Custodial History

After Zipporah's death her archive was kept and maintained by her son Geoffrey Woodward. A selection of those papers and other memorabilia was donated by his daughter Paisley Woodward to University Archives in 2025.

Scope and Content

Fonds consists of materials acquired or created by Zipporah Ritchie "Zippy" Woodward. These materials reflect her life as a mid-twentieth century Vancouver "society" lady, as well as an artist and a supporter of the arts and of UBC. They include incoming correspondence, photographs, a photograph album, poetry (typed and handwritten) from Woodward's friends and family, several unpublished pieces written by Woodward, typescripts of her newspaper column "Letters of a Mother to Her Son", newspaper clippings, published items, and a pin and ribbon from the Alpha Delta Phi fraternity. Of particular interest are four folders of letters and other written material from noted Canadian writer Ethel Wilson. The fonds is arranged in three series: Correspondence, Memorabilia, and Photographs.

Series Descriptions

Correspondence series. -1920-1975.

37 cm of textual materials.

Series consists of correspondence and related textual materials, mainly newspaper clippings and poetry, received by Zipporah Woodward. They represent the wide circle of friends that she had among Vancouver's social and cultural elite, including J.V. Clyne, Lauren Harris, H.R. MacMillan, Dorothy Somerset, Aldyen Hamber, and Stu Keate, among many others. Of particular interest are four folders of letters and other written materials from noted Canadian writer Ethel Wilson.

The files are arranged in alphabetical order, by correspondent, and chronologically within each file.

Memorabilia series. – 1930-1972. 11 cm of textual materials. Ephemera.

Series consists of a variety of materials that reflect Zipporah Woodward's activities and interests. They include her unpublished pieces, typescripts of her newspaper column "Letters of a Mother to Her Son", UBC Players' Club materials (in particular her production of *Candida*), poems written for her (authors unidentified), UBC materials, and items from the memorial for her son-in-law and UBC chancellor A.E. "Dal" Grauer.

The files are arranged in chronological order.

Photographs series. – 1906-1972. 25 photographs. Ephemera.

Series consists of photographs of various sizes, and one photograph album. Some images document Zipporah Woodward and her life, others are from her friends.
