Collector's Administrative History

The Western Universities Battalion was formed in 1916 with membership drawn primarily from the student populations of the Universities of Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia. The organizers that a distinctive western unit composed exclusively of men of similar background would be desirable, and to this end they sought to attract "those earnest, studious men of practised intellect and proved ability, who are most fitted to play their parts as leaders of men in the most difficult and complex science of modern warfare." The recruiting and organization of "D" Company (British Columbia) was entrusted to Major R.W. Brock. The unit was housed on the UBC campus (then on the site of the current Vancouver General Hospital) with drilling, marching and arms training taking place on the King Edward High School grounds. "D" Company joined the rest of the W.U.B. at Camp Hughes in Manitoba and members of the Battalion saw their first action in Europe early in 1917.

Scope and Content

The collection consists of pamphlets, correspondence, addresses, menus, publications, diagrams, maps, and photographs assembled by members of the Western Universities Battalion, "D" Company.
