## FONDS DESCRIPTION

### **Doyle, Henry, 1874-1961**

Henry Doyle fonds. - 1866-1959.

1.2 m of textual records and other material.

#### **Biographical sketch**

Born in Paterson, New Jersey, Henry Doyle moved with his family to San Francisco in 1875, where his father established the fish supply firm of Henry Doyle and Company. In 1890 the younger Doyle was sent to British Columbia on a mission for his father's firm. In 1895 he became manager of the new Doyle Fishing Company (Canadian Division) in Vancouver. After the death of his father in 1898, Doyle became General Manager of the entire company. He was appointed the first General Manager of the British Columbia Packers' Association in 1902. Doyle's career in the Pacific fishery industry spanned over sixty years, and included positions such as President and General Manager of Skeena River Commercial Company, Limited (beginning 1904), Managing Director of the Fort Nelson Canning and Salting Company (1905), co-operator of the Lighthouse Cannery at Steveston and the Royal Packing Company (beginning 1906), owner of the Mill Bay Cannery and the Namu and Kimsquit canneries (1908-1916), part-owner of Draney Fisheries Ltd. (beginning 1912), and part-owner of the Winch-Doyle Northern B.C. Fisheries (1916-1923). Doyle was also involved with fisheries committees, including the Select Standing Committee on Marine and Fisheries and the Parliamentary Fisheries Committee in the early 1920s. In 1948 Doyle developed an interest in the incursion of hydro-electric dams into sockeye spawning areas. He completed his manuscript *Rise and Decline of the Pacific Salmon Fisheries* in 1957.

#### **Scope and content:**

The fonds consists of material created or assembled by Doyle pertaining to his many interests in the Pacific fishery industry. Includes correspondence (1902-1957), notebooks, legal documents, notes, speeches, clippings, printed material, reports, statistics on B.C. companies and canneries, a scrapbook, as well as several photographs and maps. Fonds also includes records of and pertaining to the B.C. Canners' Association, B.C. Packers' Association, the Select Standing Committee on Marine and Fisheries, and the Parliamentary Fisheries Committee. Also included is Doyle's manuscript of *Rise and Decline of the Pacific Salmon Fisheries*.

**Source of supplied title:** Title based on the contents of the fonds.

**Physical description note:** Includes 95 photographs, 25 maps, 9 charts, and 1 plan.

**Immediate source of acquisition:** The collection was donated to the University of British Columbia Library circa 1960, prior to Doyle's death.

**Arrangement:** The material has been arranged several times resulting in the loss of any original order that may have existed. The present arrangement is based upon the series order devised by Judy Coombs in 1971 and in 1973.

**Restrictions:** No restrictions on access.

**Finding aids:** File list is available.

**Associated material:** The University of Washington Library holds Henry Doyle correspondence, documents, and scrapbooks concerning the British Columbia salmon fishery, 1877-1935.

**Accruals:** No further accruals are expected.

**Related groups of records in a different fonds:** See also the British Columbia Packers Ltd. fonds at this institution.

## SERIES DESCRIPTIONS

**Personal papers and correspondence.** – 1900-1938. – 30.75 cm textual records.  
Series consists of Doyle's incoming and outgoing correspondence, as well as biographical material documenting some of his career in the fishing industry.  
Title based on contents of series.

**Biographical material.** – [ca. 1957]. – 0.25 cm textual records.  
Sub-series consists of the postscript to Doyle's *Rise and Decline of the Pacific Salmon Fisheries*, which contains an outline of his involvement in the fisheries.  
Title based on contents of sub-series.

**Incoming correspondence.** – 1902-1959. – 13 cm textual records.  
Sub-series consists of correspondence received by Doyle, including letters of a business nature, letters related to his involvement with various fisheries associations and organizations, and correspondence pertaining to his concerns regarding hydro-electric dams.  
Letters arranged alphabetically according to correspondent.  
Title based on contents of sub-series.

**Outgoing correspondence.** – 1902-1959. – 14.5 cm textual records.  
Sub-series consists of Doyle's outgoing correspondence.  
Letters arranged chronologically.  
Title based on contents of sub-series.

**Correspondence concerning hydro-electric power dam construction.**  
– 1948-1958. – 1 volume.  
Sub-series consists of copies of incoming and outgoing correspondence and related documents regarding Doyle's concern with the effect of hydro-electric power dam construction on sockeye salmon spawning areas.  
Title based on contents of sub-series.

**Miscellaneous correspondence.** – [1902-1921]. – 2 cm textual records.  
Sub-series consists of miscellaneous incoming and outgoing correspondence, mainly of a business nature. Includes a few letters related to Doyle's position as General Manager of the British Columbia Packers Association.  
Title based on contents of sub-series.

**Account and record books.** – [1866-1921]. – 3 volumes.  
Series consists of an account book for the Mill Bay Cannery, 1905-1906, as well as books containing catch and packing records.  
Title based on contents of series.

**Notebooks.** – 1900-1922. – 29 notebooks.

Series consists of notebooks kept by Doyle containing fisheries statistics, figures, and other types of information. Includes notebooks containing information on the operations of the Skeena River Commercial Company, and the Namu, Mill Bay, Kimsquit, Kumeon, Port Essington and Port Edward, Bella Coola, Tallheo canneries. Series also includes notes on the British Columbia Packers Association, 1903-1908, and general journals kept by Doyle, 1905 to 1922, containing information on his business dealings and other cannery-related issues.

**Notes.** – [ca. 1921-1942]. – 1 cm textual records.

Series consists of notes regarding fish processing, salmon runs, and other fisheries-related topics.

Title based on contents of series.

**Speeches and writings.** – 1901-1956. – 6 cm textual records.

Series consists of speeches and other writings by Doyle and others relating to the British Columbia fishing industry.

Title based on contents of series.

**Speeches and writings by Doyle.** – 1901-1956. – 3 cm textual records.

Sub-series consists of speeches and other writings by Doyle concerning the history of the Pacific Coast salmon industry, British Columbia fishing industry licensing, legislation and regulation, the conservation of fish populations, salmon canning, and canning industry management. Includes also a summary of the ownership of some British Columbia canneries and processing plants, including Namu, Mill Bay, and Kimsquit, 1914-1930.

Title based on contents of sub-series.

**Speeches and writings by others.** – 1919-1955. – 3 cm textual records.

Sub-series consists of reports, addresses, and other writings relating to British Columbia fisheries, including material pertaining to the conservation and propagation of the salmon population, and to industry organization, production and regulation. Includes a circa 1942 prospectus of a proposed Fishermens Co-operative Packing Company in British Columbia.

Title based on contents of sub-series.

**Legal documents.** – 1900-1910. – 5 cm textual records.

Series consists of legal documents concerning the Inverness Cannery and the Nass River Cannery, and clippings of legal notices pertaining to fisheries.

Title based on contents of series.

**Law and legislation documents.** –1895-1918. – 1 cm textual records.

Series consists of documents relating to legislation and legal cases concerning the fisheries in British Columbia and Washington state.

Series arranged chronologically.

Title based on contents of series.

**Statistics.** – [1872-1942]. – 12 cm textual records.

Series consists of various fisheries statistics gathered by Doyle. Includes statistics for individual British Columbia canning, packing, and other fishing industry companies, as well as general statistics regarding various subjects.

Title based on contents of series.

**Reports.** – 1930, 1948-1955. – 0.5 cm textual records.

Series consists of a report on the potential development of the Coast Range Steel Limited Company (1930-1932) and copies of newspaper reports, resolutions, briefs, and submissions concerning the threat posed to the salmon fishing industry by the construction of hydro-electric dams.

Title based on contents of series.

**Clippings.** – 1947-1958. – 1 cm textual records.

Series consists of journal and newspaper clippings relating mainly to salmon conservation, including many clippings concerning the threat posed to the salmon population by the construction of hydro-electric dams on the Fraser River and other salmon spawning routes, as well as some clippings regarding industry development.

Title based on contents of series.

**Printed material.** – [ca. 1900]-1959. – 20 cm textual records.

Series consists of annual reports, bulletins, pamphlets and other printed material related to fisheries in British Columbia and the American Pacific coast.

Title based on contents of series.

**Scrapbook.** – 1935-1945. – 1 scrapbook.

Series consists of a scrapbook containing reports and journal and newspaper clippings, correspondence and other material relating to the Pacific Coast fishing industry. Includes annual and shareholders reports of B.C. Packers Ltd., 1935-1937, and the 1936 annual report of the California Packing Corporation.

Title based on contents of series.

**Photographs.** – [1902-192-]. – 95 photographs : b&w ; various dimensions.

Series consists of photographs of various canneries, cannery owners and employees in British Columbia, and a photograph of the 1920 Canadian Fisheries Association convention.

**Maps, charts and plans.** – [191-? - prior to 1960] – 25 maps. 9 charts. 1 plan.

Series consists of original and photostat copies of maps, charts and plans relating to early British Columbia history, coastal waters, and the fishing industry.

**British Columbia Canners' Association records.** – 1899-1922, 1938. – 22.5 cm textual records.

Series consists of records pertaining to the British Columbia Canners' Association, and Doyle's involvement with the Association. Includes records of the Fraser River Canners' Association, the Rivers Inlet Canners and other groups.

Title based on contents of series.

**Correspondence.** – 1899-1922. – 10.5 cm textual records.

Sub-series consists of correspondence and related minutes and other documents of the British Columbia Canners' Association, Fraser River Canners' Association and the Rivers Inlet Canners.

Sub-series is arranged chronologically.

Title based on contents of sub-series.

**Minutes, resolutions, agreements.** – 1904-1922, 1938. – 9.5 cm textual records.

Sub-series consists of minutes, resolutions, and agreements of the British Columbia Canners' Association, Fraser River Canners' Association, Rivers Inlet Canners, and other related associations.

Sub-series is arranged chronologically.

Title based on contents of sub-series.

**Statistics and reports.** – 1903-1920. – 2.5 cm textual records.

Sub-series consists of statistics and reports collected by the B.C. Canners Association from various canneries and fishing centres.

**British Columbia Packers' Association records.** – 1902-1921. – 2 cm textual records.

Series consists of records pertaining to the British Columbia Packers' Association and Doyle's involvement with the Association. Includes reports, statistics, correspondence, incorporation-related records, and directors' reports.

**Reports, statistics, and correspondence.** – 1902-1921. – 1 cm textual records.

Sub-series consists of reports, statistics and correspondence of and relating to the British Columbia Packer's Association.

Title based on contents of sub-series.

**Incorporation records and directors' reports.** – 1902-1907. – 1 cm textual records.

Sub-series consists of early records of the British Columbia Packers' Association, including a proposal to create the Association written by Henry Doyle in February, 1922, as well as the Association's Certificate of Incorporation, and Directors' reports for 1904 to 1907.

Title based on contents of sub-series.

**Select Standing Committee on Marine and Fisheries proceedings.** – 1922. – 2.5 cm textual records.

Series consists of the proceedings of the Select Standing Committee on Marine and Fisheries, April 21, 1922 to June 15, 1922.

**Parliamentary Fisheries Committee evidence.** – 1922. – 7 cm

File consists of evidence of the Parliamentary Fisheries Committee investigation of the British Columbia Fisheries, August to September 1922.

Henry Doyle (1874-1961) began his involvement in the Pacific salmon fishery in 1901, and for the next two decades was a strong leader and keen observer in the industry (see Doyle's unpublished manuscript, Rise and Decline of the Pacific Salmon Fisheries, UBC Special Collections, Moway-Reed Colln.
