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INTRODUCTION

John Gace Langley married Edith Caroline Kidner in England, 1879. He was working, at the time, as a grocer, she as a butcher. By 1888 they had moved to Port Arthur, Ontario, where they and their two daughters, Celia and Winnie, lived for a few years. Around 1891 they settled in British Columbia. Over the years they had various homes, all within the environs of Vancouver. Not much is revealed about their daily life during this period, except for a single mention of Mr. Langley's occupation as a farmer in the Abbotsford area around 1918, the year before his death, and the interesting accounts written by Celia Langley in her diaries of 1915 and 1916. The diaries present a detailed picture of Vancouver life during the period of World War I, specifically as it related to her own life, and role of schoolteacher at that time.

Although most of the papers in the Langley family collection relate mainly to personal and family matters, there are some items which are of historical interest, particularly to one involved in local and/or Canadian history. Celia's diaries, as noted above, present a vivid picture of daily life in Vancouver, and the effects of World War I on life "at home". An item of special interest in this area is contained in the 1916 diary, in which Celia has transcribed a letter from a soldier "at the front" near Dover, to his mother. Also of interest to the historian would be the large postcard collection. Most of the cards present British Columbia scenes. The influence of World War I is also reflected in the postcard collection; first, in a series of patriotic postcards from Britain sent to Winnie in 1915, and second, in the form of a Field Service Postcard received by Celia during the same year. Two other interesting items within the postcard collection are:

a stamp depicting Carnegie Library and City Hall, Vancouver, B.C.
(in the Winnie Langley collection, 1907)

and

a "disaster" postcard, showing the ruins of the San Francisco City Hall after the earthquake of 1906 (in the Edith Langley collection, 1914).

The family photo album is also valuable, as it presents yet another illustration of British Columbia life in the early 1900's.

The Langley family papers were donated to The University of British Columbia by Mrs. R. Coleman, in 1975.
