Angus MacInnis was born in 1884 at Glen Williams, Prince Edward Island. In 1908 he moved to Vancouver where he worked as a milk wagon driver and later as a conductor and motorman for the B.C. Electric Railway. An interest in the trade union movement led him to become business agent for the Amalgamated Association of Street, Electrical Railway and Motor Coach Employees of America, Division 101. Politically active on both the local and national scene, he was elected M.P. for Vancouver South for the Independent Labour Party in 1930 and he served the same constituency as a member of the C.C.F. (1935-1957). In 1932, MacInnis married Grace Woodsworth. MacInnis sat on the C.C.F. National Executive from 1933-1950 and was Deputy National Leader of the C.C.F. from 1942 to 1957. His awards include an Honorary Doctor of Laws from the University of British Columbia and the Garnett Sedgewick award from the U.B.C. Civil Liberties Union for his position on the Japanese-Canadian situation during the Second World War.

The fonds consists of correspondence, speeches, newspaper clippings, subject files and other material relating to the political career and personal life of Angus MacInnis.

Scrapbooks Series. – 1930-1965.

Series consists of three scrapbooks: 57A-1, 53A-2, and 53B-1. Scrapbooks contain poetry, clippings, typescripts, and memorabilia relating to MacInnis' interests. Subjects covered include but are not limited to: labour unions, socialism, capitalism, the C.C.F., unemployment, and the Second World War.

Correspondence Series. – 1930-1955

Series consists of correspondence arranged in two sub-series: incoming/outgoing and other.

Incoming/Outgoing Correspondence Sub-series. -1930-1956.

Sub-series includes personal and work related correspondence on subjects primarily related to MacInnis' interest in politics. Sub-series is arranged chronologically by correspondent.

Other Correspondence Sub-series. – 1933-1951.

Sub-series consists of correspondence to or from J. Hutchinson, J.W. Hope, W.A. Pritchard, J.S. Woodsworth, David Lewis, F.J. McKenzie, Herbert W. Herridge, and Harold Winch. Sub-series is arranged chronologically.

Subject Files Series. – 1938-1959.

Series consists of files on external affairs, minorities, provincial leadership, the North Atlantic Pact, and trade unions. Series is arranged by subject and chronologically within each subject.

Speeches Series. – 1934-1956.

Series consists of political speeches. Series is arranged chronologically.

Notes Series. – [194-?-195?].

Series consists of various notes on the Elections Act, the Chief Electoral Officer Report, capitalism, big business, Nazism, the C.C.F., and progress for blacks in the United States.
