Thomas Gratham Norris was born in Victoria on September 14, 1893. His father, a newspaper man, died when he was five and he was raised by his mother. Norris was educated in Victoria and graduated from McGill University, Victoria in 1909. In 1911 Norris enrolled as a student-at-law with Barnard, Robertson and Heisterman.

World War I interrupted Norris' studies when he joined the 3rd Battery Canadian Field Artillery in France and Belgium and received the military bar and cross for his efforts. Norris later re-enlisted during World War II to serve as deputy Judge Advocate General.

In 1911 Norris was called and admitted to the B.C. Bar. He began practising in Kelowna as a solicitor for the soldier Settlement Board. He later joined a private practice where he gained considerable knowledge of agricultural problems, irrigation law, marketing law and constitutional law while representing groups such as the B.C. Fruit Growers Association and participating on the Kelowna Board of Trade. He was appointed as Queen's Counsel in 1932. Norris left Kelowna in 1935 to begin practising in Vancouver.

Between 1945 and 1959 Norris practiced in Vancouver with Norris, Cumming and Bird. Viewed as a fierce courtroom fighter, Norris was also regarded as an affable man who enjoyed his 25 acre home and extensive rose garden, located in Pitt Meadows. In 1959 the Diefenbaker government appointed Norris to the Supreme Court of

British Columbia. In 1961 Norris was elevated to the Appeal Court of British Columbia. Norris was also appointed as Deputy District Judge in Admiralty in 1960 and as District Judge in Admiralty in 1961. Norris was also appointed to the Court of Appeal, Yukon Territories. On July 17, 1962, Norris was recalled from vacation and placed in charge of the "Industrial Commission as to Shipping in the Great Lakes and St. Lawrence River System," also known as the Hal Banks Inquiry, over which he presided for 108 days. Widely respected for his independent thinking and dedication to the law, Norris retired from practise on the eve of his seventy-fifth birthday in 1968.

In addition to his long legal career, Norris was involved in a variety of other interests: the Kelowna Board of Trade, the Vancouver Board of Trade, the Conservative Party Association, the Law Society of British Columbia, the Vancouver Bar Association and the B.C. Borstal Association. In 1948 he was elected as president of Vancouver Bar Association. Between 1947 and 1957 Norris was a Bencher of the Law Society of British Columbia and Treasurer from 1957 and 1959. In 1969 the society recognized him as a life Bencher. Norris was also a founder and president of the B.C. Borstal Association.

Thomas Norris passed away 7, October 1976.

The Norris Papers document the legal and judicial career of the Honourable Mr. Justice Thomas G. Norris. The papers date between 1912 and 1975, with the bulk of records dating between 1930 and 1975 documenting his law practice and his years on the Supreme and Appeal Courts of British Columbia.

The collections consists of two parts. Owing to a previous donation of annotated transcripts of the hearings of the "Industrial Commission as to Shipping in the Great Lakes and St. Lawrence River System" in 1963; other material relating to the investigation of the activities of Harold Banks was donated in December, 1989. These papers consist of correspondence and printed material, including scrapbooks relating to the Industrial Commission as well as case notes and legal papers relating to other cases, 1947 - 71, (2 meters). The 108 volumes and index to the hearings are catalogued (SP HE 769 A25).

Part II of the collection was donated to the Legal Archives of B.C. in January, 1989, where it was processed by the archivist, Bernice Chong. The papers were transferred to the UBC Library in the spring of 1990. The collection consists of professional files, judicial subject files, case files, personal papers, miscellaneous papers and photographs (7 meters). Each series has particular strengths and provides an insight about Norris and B.C.'s legal system.

The professional files in Part II consist mostly of case files generated by Norris during his years as a lawyer in Kelowna and Vancouver. Also included in his series are subject files with additional information about areas of interest. For example, Norris created several files with documentation on the Associated Fruit Growers Ltd. and other marketing boards (1927 - 49). Other interesting subjects include the Kelowna Polic Inquiry (1929 - 30), the Japanese claim Commission (1950), Rex v. Ducharme - murder case

(1950), and politics (1932-35). The "Politics" files provide a great deal of information about Norris' Conservative party interests and the process behind the appointment of a lawyer to Queen's counsel.

The judicial subject files (1958 - 75) document Norris' career on the Bench and his subject interests. The files include correspondence surrounding his appointment to various levels of the judiciary, files created during his judicial career and other judicial matters. For example, files often contain judgements, cases considered, clipping and other related materials. The case of Regina vs Bob & White documents the various issues considered before a decision was handed down on aboriginal hunting and fishing rights in B.C. Also included in this series are documents relating to the St. Lawrence Seaway Inquiry. Other files include subjects of the law such as divorce, Native Indians and Legal Aid. Files also included records created about the Admiralty Court, the Supreme and Appeal Courts of British Columbia and the Yukon Territorial Courts.

Another series is case files which includes court documents and notes drafted by Norris. These case files were separated from other case files by Norris probably because of personal interests and the volume of materials. Each subseries of records document a case: Buttle Lake, in Strathona Park (1951), the Vancouver Policy Inquiry (1955), B.C. Telephone's Application for rate increases (1950), Royal Commission on Energy (1958) and Gordon Wismer v. MacLean Hunter (1954). The Buttle Lake files include transcripts of hearings conducted in Courtenay and Victoria, notes and some materials related to submissions presented to the Water Comptroller. Norris represented several groups opposed to the construction of the dam at Buttle Lake. The Wismer v. MacLean-Hunter files include examinations for discovery of Blair Fraser and Gordon S. Wismer, briefs and other materials used by Norris as he represented the Attorney General of B.C., Gordon S. Wismer against MacLean-Hunter magazine in a slander and libel suit.

There are also some personal papers in this collection. Although this series reflect personal interests of Norris, they also contain business or legal related matters. For example, in this series are materials and correspondence relating to the Law Society of B.C., the Law Society & Yale Bar Association meeting in 1958 and arrangements for the 1952 Judge Advocate luncheon. Other files reflect upon friendships with individuals such as Hugh Keenlyside and Leon Koerner.

The miscellaneous series contains papers include related court documents, some correspondence, legal notes and ephemeral material.

The scrapbook presented to Norris by the B.C. Fruit Growers Association is evidence of the close relationship between Norris and the Association. The 1931 clippings document the issues that were debated as different marketing groups investigated the possibility of marketing boards.

The photograph is an image of the Law Society of B.C. convention in Vernon, B.C., July 1952.

Additional professional files created while Norris was practicing law in Kelowna (file#663-1109) were discovered and donated in August, 1990, and have been added to the end of the inventory.

**SERIES DESCRIPTIONS, Part II**

**Professional Files, 1912-56.** 3.36 m. (Boxes 9-1 to 29-19)

Arranged Numerically

This series consists of files created by Norris during his Kelowna and Vancouver practice. The series has been arranged according to Norris' office filing system which was based on assigning numbers according to a client's case. Subject files are also interspersed in this series with numbers assigned for office filing.

**Judicial Subject Files, 1958-75.** 2 m. (Boxes 30-1 to 35-30)

Arranged Alphabetically

This series consists of subject files created by Norris during his tenure on the Bench. The various typed and handwritten labels suggests that office and home files were mixed together and filed in an alphabetical manner.

**Case Files, 1950-58.** 72.5 cm. (Boxes 36-1 to 38-4)

Unarranged

This series consists of files related to cases. It appeared that Norris had selected these files for his collection. Most of these cases appeared to be well-documented in the newspapers.

**Personal Papers, 1935-75.** 13 cm. (Box 39)

Arranged Alphabetically

These files had no visible original order. The documents include mostly correspondence and records of a personal nature.

**Miscellaneous Papers, 1939-74.** 20 cm. (Boxes 40-1 to 41-8)

Unarranged

These records had no visible original order. This series includes correspondence, memorabilia and court documents.

**Scrapbook, 1931** 1 item (Box 42-1)

This scrapbook was presented to Norris by the B.C. Fruit Growers Association.

**Photograph, 1952** 1 item (Box 42-2)
