**Biographical sketch:**

G. Vernon Wellburn was born in 1925 and raised in Duncan, BC. He worked for BC Forest Products Ltd. and the Tahsis Company Ltd. in engineering and logging management at various locations on Vancouver Island and Vancouver. From 1972 to 19975 he lectured on forest harvesting in the Faculty of Forestry at UBC and was the Western Manager of the Forest Engineering Institute of Canada from 1975 to 1980.

- 1-1 Letter, Sir John Franklin, Great Bear Lake to Robt. McVicar, Chief Trader, Hudson's Bay Co., February, 1826
- 1-2 Invitation to the Mr. R. E. Barkley family to attend the opening of New Parliament Buildings in Victoria, British Columbia, February 10, 1898
- 1-3 Telegram from S.L. Tilley, Ottawa to Hon. Dr. Helmcken, April 1, 1871. The telegram refers to the admittance of British Columbia into confederation – "Final vote admitting British Columbia passed lower House the Evening after hard fight...."
- 1-4 Legal Document (handwritten) signed by Charles Dupont, July 22, 1884. The document refers to a land transaction to what is now known as Vancouver.
