The University of British Columbia Library branch @ St. Paul's Hospital is located in Providence Building Level 1 Room 1555. The UBC Library licenses ~38,000 e-journal titles and thousands of e-books, including significant health e-collections - almost all with remote access. As part of the [Transition to Online](#) initiative and as the UBC Library licenses e-journals directly from publishers, print subscriptions are cancelled. Currently the SPH branch has a print collection of ~7000 books and ~40 current journal subscriptions. It is networked with other UBC Library branches by an online information system and self-ordering services to provide access to print materials located at [other UBC campuses](#) (document delivery) and [elsewhere](#) (interlibrary loan).

Internet Workstations (with MS Office and more), printer, copiers, and Internet Access (Ethernet) Ports are situated in the SPH Library. UBC Wi-Fi www.wireless.ubc.ca (ubcsecure only, CWL required) is available in the Library and surrounding areas. PHC/VCH Wi-Fi is available only for PHC/VCH owned VTAG'd equipment — contact PHC IMIS Help Desk at 604-806-9333 or email helpdesk@providencehealth.bc.ca for configuration.

A library card is required to obtain most services and to borrow books. With photo identification and a student or employee number, UBC students, staff, & faculty may pick up their official UBC identification card - the UBCCard www.ubccard.ubc.ca - in person at the UBCCard office in the Point Grey campus bookstore www.bookstore.ubc.ca. By default for two weeks, the initial PIN is the last 5 digits of the barcode. Faculty may authorize others to access services in their name, go to: www.library.ubc.ca/home/forms/facauthform.pdf.

CAMPUS WIDE LOGIN (CWL): www.cwl.ubc.ca

A campus wide login is required to obtain some e-services, including accessing UBC Wi-Fi and Ethernet. Self register for an account online with your student or employee number.

UBC LIBRARY WEB: www.library.ubc.ca

Access to the UBC catalogue, subject guides, handouts & tutorials, indexes & databases resources.library.ubc.ca, full-text e-journals & e-books, document delivery (borrow from other branches) & interlibrary loan (borrow from other libraries) services, My Library Account (renewals, check DocDel/ILL/recall requests) is available on the Library Web.

Selected citation databases include Biosis, CAB Global Health, CINAHL, Conference Papers Index, EMBase, Environmental Sciences & Pollution Management, HaPI, IPA, MEDline, PapersFirst, PapersInvited, PsycINFO, PubMed, SportDiscus, and Web of Science. Most of the citation databases provide a seamless e-Link to full-text e-articles and a print journal catalogue search or order from other libraries form. Look for the UBC eLink icon. 

Use RefWorks refworks.library.ubc.ca to create personal databases, manage citations, and format in-text references and bibliographies automatically in MS Word.

Fulltext databases include Academic Search Complete, Access Medicine, BioMed Central, Biomedical Reference Collection, Books@Ovid, Canadian Health Research Collection, Canadian Newstand, CANSIM, CCOHS Web, Clinical Evidence, Cochrane databases, E-STAT (Statistics Canada), e-Therapeutics (e-CPS +), First Consult, Health Reference Center, JNCI Online, JSTOR, LexisNexis, MD Consult, Mental Measurements Yearbook, NAP National Academies Press, Natural Standard, Nature Protocols, Proquest Dissertations & Theses, PsycBOOKS, STATnetBASE, STAT!Ref, Theses Canada Portal, and more.

CONNECTING FROM HOME OR OFFICE:

Two options are available:

- myVPN requires CWL account and install privileges on your computer;
- EZProxy requires a [UBCCard](#)/PIN, a [Faculty Authorization library card](#)/PIN, or a [CWL](#) account. When connecting to a UBC licensed e-resource, EZProxy will automatically determine that you are accessing remotely and ask you to login.

CONNECTING FROM PROVIDENCE HEALTH CARE (PHC) Intranet:


- PHC supports remote access via EZProxy as detailed above.

Access to some databases and full-text is licensed for PHC staff and is available on all PHC Internet-connected computers from the PHC Connect intranet.phc.ca menu, under Electronic Health Library Resources (e-HLbc). Providers include Ovid ovidsp.ovid.com and Ebsco search.ebscohost.com. Additional e-resources may be licensed by PHC, eg. e-CPS.

To obtain print material from other UBC branches, place a docdel order while you are in an article database (eg.

Medline - click on UBC eLink icon ) or in the UBC catalogue. Most articles are delivered post-to-web; most books are available for pickup at the Services Desk within two weekdays, after 2pm. For items not available at UBC in print or electronically, self-order through the ILL service. For other ordering options, see www.library.ubc.ca/life/ill.
