## THE FREDERIC WOOD THEATRE FOUNDATION

Believing that theatre has an important place in the cultural life of a university and of a nation, and wishing to encourage the future development of the Frederic Wood Theatre Programme, the University, in 1962, established the Frederic Wood Theatre Foundation, a permanent endowment, the annual income from which will be devoted to enhancing the artistic merit of the theatre's productions.

The Frederic Wood Theatre is deeply grateful to all those who have contributed to the Foundation. Its objective is an ambitious one, \$100,000.00, and it will probably be two or three years before it is realized.
