“All the way from *Enter a Free Man*, which was 1960, to *Travesties* in 1974, I've written what appealed to me, and I've written it with the assumption that it would appeal to everybody else — If you don't actually write from that standpoint, you get into deep trouble.”

Born in Czechoslovakia and educated in England, Tom Stoppard made a swift transition from newspaper reporter and free-lance journalist in the late 1950's to one of England's most important and popular playwrights in the 1970's. It was *Rosencrantz and Guildenstern* — first produced on the fringe of the 1966 Edinburgh Festival and the following year at the National Theatre — that established Stoppard as a major playwright. Originally it was a one-act burlesque that had Rosencrantz and Guildenstern meeting King Lear upon their arrival in England! He rewrote the script, concentrated on earlier events at Elsinore and kept the two attendant lords as central characters. Stoppard acknowledges the influence of Samuel Beckett during this period of his writing and, like Valdimir and Estragon, Rosencrantz and Guildenstern become figures who act out their author's concern about the human condition. The play was appreciated for its philosophical content but, above all, for its bold and clever manipulation of two minor Shakespearean characters within the framework of Shakespeare's greatest play.

Stoppard went on to write such highly-theatrical successes as *Jumpers*, *Travesties*, *Dirty Linen* and *Every Good Boy Deserves Favour*, a play for actors and orchestra. His newest play, *Night and Day*, is currently a success in London and will soon be produced on Broadway.
