Thornton Wilder, whose Pulitzer prize winning comedy of serious intent, THE SKIN OF OUR TEETH, premiered in 1942, regarded the theatre as greatest of all art forms. Though exploring no less than the ability of the human race to persevere in the face of nature's destructive powers and man's own folly, ignorance and cruelty, he remained convinced that the artistic validity of a play depended on the frank admission that the pursuit of truth is via make-believe. His personal and unique use of traditional devices — the telescoping of time, the pageantry of philosophies and poetic ideas, the destruction of the production itself by having actors step out of roles to address the audience directly — was a radical innovation in the 20th Century theatre dominated by realistic convention. Wilder's vision had a dark side, but on the eve of America's entry into World War II his view of life was that a faltering, absurd but noble mankind would survive in spite of itself.

Tonight in the spirit of a carnival midway our company places itself with you in a theatre in New York City at the time when we've all just come through the depression by ... "the skin of our teeth".


