# Fonds Description

## Biographical Sketch

William Orson “Wobby” Banfield (1897-1983) entered UBC in 1915. The following year he joined the armed forces, serving in France with the 68th Battery until 1918. Returning to UBC, he graduated in 1922 with a B.A.Sc. He also joined the Alpha Iota fraternity and served as treasurer of the Students’ Council. In 1923 he earned an M.A.Sc. – his thesis was entitled “The viscosity of pure hydrogen bromide and solutions of cetic acid and ethyl alcohol in hydrogen bromide.”

## Scope and Content

Fonds consists of one file folder of materials collected or acquired by W. Orson Banfield during his time at UBC, including event programmes, correspondence, and a matriculation certificate; and six photographs documenting the 1922 Great Trek.
