Biographical Sketch

Janet Thomson Greig graduated from Queen's University and taught French in schools in Quebec and Vancouver prior to joining the Department of Modern Languages at UBC in 1922. She enjoyed a 23 year career at the university, and during that time she completed her M.A. in 1926. She retired from the university in 1944. In her lifetime she was made Officer D'Academie avec Palmes Academique and was presented with the Medal of the Alliance Francaise for her work on French culture.

Scope and Content

The fonds consists of materials collected by Greig on her trip east to the Jacques Cartier Celebration in 1934, materials on French Canadian folk songs, the International celebration of Niagara, and awards Ms. Greig received.
